I. Organizational Information

CharityHelp International (CHI) is a young pioneering non-profit based in Annapolis, Maryland. Founded in 2004, CHI assists small grass roots organizations in emerging nations that provide educational, child care, sustainable community development, health, and other charitable services in their local communities. CHI provides local non-profit groups with information and communications technology, internet based financial transaction capability, online database resources and technical expertise so donors worldwide can support their projects.

Our philosophy is to create a better world one project at a time by facilitating the cultivation of long-term relationships between donors and community-based programs. We believe that enabling two-way communication will foster long-term support and most importantly, increase cross-cultural understanding, ultimately enriching the lives of both donors and recipients. With the rapid expansion of the availability of low-cost internet based communications, our program can be expanded on a scale never before possible. *CHI envisions the creation of an on-line community that works with eligible programs to promote sustainable change and development in emerging nations.*

We are helping very diverse local community based projects discover new ways to share their focus and culture with donors around the world. Our pilot project with the Revolutionary Association of the Women of Afghanistan (RAWA) currently supports three orphanages and more than 140 children. CHI is using our partnership with RAWA, the oldest political/social Afghan women's group, as our model for working with new projects. CHI's model of partnership uses the internet and low-cost technology to give donors and recipients a window into each other's world. Donors are able to gain first hand insight into the culture and experience of the local peoples, share their lives through letters and pictures via email, and build lasting relationships.

Our second project, Kalyani, a new partnership initiative for establishing sustainable communities is progressing on a seven-acre campus south of the university town of Kalyani, West Bengal, India. The community will prove new technologies and reach out to provide support and opportunity for the rural people living close by.

Our third project is Ripples International - a Kenya based organization focused on the welfare of children made orphan or vulnerable from the impact of HIV/AIDS. The low estimates state that there are approximately 27,000 orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) in the Meru Central district. Ripples is currently able to serve approximately 547 OVC, 32 abandoned children under the age of 2 years, and 200 people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA).

CharityHelp and Orphans International Worldwide have teamed up to provide child sponsorship opportunities in Sri Lanka, Haiti and Indonesia. Orphans International was founded by former investment banker Jim Luce in 1999 as a response to the global crisis facing orphaned children. OIWW has established a network of locally incorporated homes to house and educate children orphaned and abandoned after the Tsunami in Sri Lanka and Indonesia, and the 2004 hurricane in Haiti.
